We are submitting the annual plan covering all arena of our institution for the academic Session 2009-10 as approached by the IQAC in its meeting held on 02-07-2010 and the achievements for the same period in Part A.

Part A: Criteria –wise Analysis

Criterion I : Curricular Aspects

Our Plan of work

The college authority persistently endeavours to introduce new courses to extend academic opportunities and also tries to increase the strength of both teaching and non- teaching staff to ensure quality both in areas of academics and administration.

Execution of the Plan

In the academic year 2009-2010, five wholtime teachers in substantive posts have joined in the Departments of History, Journalism and Mass Communication, Anthropology, Zoology and Botany.

Criterion II : Teaching – Learning and Evaluation

Our Plan of Work

The college has maintained status quo in the administration procedure. The circulation of an updated Academic Calendar helps the three wings of the institution – the teachers, ther students and the administration to perform their respective functions in a timely and proper manner.

Execution of the Plan.

The Academic Sub- Committee in our college supervises all the issues/ matters relating to the teaching – learning and evaluation process. Academic Calendar of 2009-10 shows 249 working days and 192 teaching days. Present teacher- students ratio is 1 : 44 and invited / endowment lecturers have been organized by various faculties.

Criterion III : Research, Consultancy and Extension

Our Plan of work

Two Minor Research Projects are sanctioned by the UGC in 2009-2010 session. Our NSS unit is working sincerely to reach its scheduled programme.

Execution of the Plan :

College authority always encourages the faculties to upgrade their knowledge for value addition in higher education. The Annual Journal of the college, consisting of scholarly articles by the faculties helps to enrich both the teachers and interested students in their academic pursuit. ‘

Criterion IV : Infrastructure and Learning Resources :

Our Plan of work

The college has pursued an upgradation of the Laboratories as before. The college has spent Rs. 38,445/- for developing infrastructural facilities and Rs. 11,21,856/- for the construction of Women’s Hostel.

Execution of the Plan

The college purchased 1,113 books and subscribed 4 renowned journals by spending Rs. 2,21,912/- from college fund. The college spent Rs. 1,17,772/- for purchasing new computers.

Criterion V : Students support and Progression

Our Plan of Work

The faculties try to attain 100% success rate of the students in University examinations. The college authority takes necessary measures to financially assist the needy and meritorious students to check the number of drop out cases. Moreover, separate fund is maintained by the college administration for annual sports, annual cultural programme and also for outdoor games of the students. An Women’s Cell is also formed look after the interests of the female students of the college.

Execution of the Plan :

The college spent Rs. 7,500/- as stipend to Bidi Sramiks. So far as University Examination are concerned the success rate of 1st Year students is 97%, for 2nd Year it is 97.04% and it stand 96.98% for the 3rd Year students.

Criterion VI : Leadership and Governance

Plan of work

The college authority extends its hands of cooperation to implement all the policies and decisions, taken by different Sub- Committees, which remain active throughout the year. The Governing Body provides an over all leadership over the functioning of the college.

Execution of work

The college administration has appointed three Part time Lecturer for ensuring better service to the students.

The college persistently endeavours to maintain and improve the practices which were introduced before NAAC visit.

Execution of the Plan

The three wings of college – College - teachers, non-teaching staff and the students have worked sincerely to maintain all the innovative practices such as – Parent- teacher meeting, teachers' evaluation by students, interaction with Alumni Association, collective programme with local bodies, extension of the NSS activities etc in the 2009-2010 academic session.

Part- B

1. **Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution :**

The emblem of the college which expresses the determination to promote perseverance, knowledge and empowerment of the students along with the depiction of a pen and book in the flame of a lamp eloquently defines the goals and objectives of the institution. Regular classes, continuous evaluation, remedial classes, parent –teacher meeting and also feedback from our students are being considered regularly as the measures adopted for the achievement of our goal

Each Honours department takes periodic class tests and the performance of the students in these tests is analysed in the departmental committee meetings and in the parent-teacher meetings and necessary measures are taken for improvement. Moreover, before the publication of the result of each terminal examination, the Academic sub- committee examines thoroughly the results of the students along with their attendance records and suggests measures for improving the performance. In addition, the guardians of the weak students in merit and in attendance are met by the Principal or the Departmental Heads to appraise the performance of their wards.

The college authority has motivated the teachers to join 'FIP' for acquiring Ph.D. degree. In this situation, college administration has appointed a library assistant on contractual basis for ensuring necessary service to the students. The college authority has repeatedly requested to the West Bengal College Service Commission for filling up the post of Librarian.

Alumni Association in our college always extends its hands of cooperation to the college administration and also to the financially backward students at the time of admission and during their filling up examination forms.

31. Support from the Parent- Teacher Association

Parent- teacher association has not yet been formed in the college. But, each department meets the parents and exchanges views regarding the performance of their wards during the Parent- Teacher Meetings organized annually.

32. Health Service :

All students are members of the Students' Health Home and get necessary treatment at a subsidised cost. The college arranges group insurance for all the bonafied students against any type of accident.

33. Performance in sports activities :

The college has its own sports department, headed by a full-time teacher. The sports department conducts Annual Sports in the winter season every year.

34. Incentives to outstanding sports persons:

At the time of admission the Admission Committee in our college may relax the admission norms for the outstanding sportspersons.

35. Students achievements and awards: The college students' team won the Champion Trophy in Inter- College Table Tennis Tournament organized by the West Bengal State University in August, 2009. Our students also participated in the Youth Parliament Contest and Quiz contest and came thirt (3rd) at the District Level in December, 2009.

36. Activities of the Guidance and Counselling cell

The college conducts guidance and counseling programme for the new entrants at the time of admission for selecting the appropriate course curriculum as per their result and interest. The same programme is conducted for the outgoing students regularly under the supervision of an expert teachers. This counselling process enriches our students for achieving their goals and objectives in addition to promoting academic excellence.

37. Placement services provided to students :

There is no such scope as yet. But in recent past, various companies absorbed some of our students from the Department of Management (Advertising, Sales Promotion and Sales Management) through campusing.

38. Development programmes for non-teaching staff:

The college authority organizes such programmes once or twice in each academic session in various areas, such as –i) upgrading of computer knowledge, ii) office management, iii) inter-personal relationship etc. for the overall development of the performance of the non-teaching staff.

39. Best Practices of the institution:

The best practices of the college include a pro-active role by the NSS unit, which arranges free coaching for the poor children in the locality and promotes an environmental awareness among the local people. The college authority also provides arsenic free water to the public living within a radius of around three (3) km. from the college premise.
